Mission Moment

The Biblical Guide to Mission Giving

The Apostle Paul wrote to the church in Philippi concerning their generous financial support of his mission and ministry (Philippians 4:10-20). Paul provides instructions for mission support through four principles for giving:

- 1. Mission support is a voluntary response to the gospel call, a spiritual investment in God's mission with faith that God will provide.
- 2. Mission support is an expression of the community of believers as a whole, and individual gifts should contribute to the needs and focus of their church community.
- 3. Mission support should be faithfully consistent. "Just as God cares for our needs daily, regularly, no matter what our needs are," so also must our mission giving be regular, no matter what the perceived need.
- 4. Mission support should be channeled through responsible agents noting accountability in the process.

Manton Weekend Backpack Program

The Manton Weekend Backpack Program is in the planning stages. This is a community-based program that will help to



feed Manton elementary aged children from pre-school through fifth grade who attend Manton School and who have little or no food on the weekends. The program is intended to assist our needy families by providing a backpack each Friday filled with six weekend meals for their children.

You can sponsor a child for \$150 which provides weekend meals for an entire school year. Any size donation will help. We're hoping the program will be ready to begin in October, 2014.

Mission Committee Update

The mission committee met on March 13. Mary Roth, speaking on behalf of Nancy Beecraft and herself, was asking for help in funding the CCT dinners. The first year and a half or so was self-sustaining. Now, not as many donations are coming in. We spoke about fundraisers, applying for grants, applying to the Advance, and sending letters to area businesses.

Linda presented a comparison chart of monies donated for the Six Lanes of the Advance for 2012 and 2013. She also showed this in a pie chart.

We made some changes in our projects for 2014 as follows: Lane 1 – Missionary Support – Paul Webster, agricultural specialist in Mujila Falls, Zambia

Lane 2 – World Mission Projects – Mujila Falls Ag Project

Lane 3 – Red Bird Mission – essential services to people in rural Appalachia

Lane 4 – Global Projects – UMCOR (quarterly), Heifer Project International, Imagine No Malaria, and Water and Sanitation, Society of St. Andrew

Lane 5 – Racial and Ethnic Local Church Greensky Hill Indian Church

Lane 6 – Conference and District Projects, Habitat for Humanity
